THE TWENTY-SEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

FIRST READING

Genesis 2: 18-24

A reading from the book of Genesis

The Lord God said, "It is not good that the man should be alone. I will make him a helpmate." So from the soil the Lord God fashioned all the wild beasts and all the birds of heaven. These he brought to the man to see what he would call them; each one was to bear the name the man would give it. The man gave names to all the cattle, all the birds of heaven and all the wild beasts. But no helpmate suitable for man was found for him. So the Lord God made the man fall into a deep sleep. And while he slept, he took one of his ribs and enclosed it in flesh. The Lord God built the rib he had taken from the man into a woman, and brought her to the man. The man exclaimed: "This at last is bone from my bones, and flesh from my flesh! This is to be called woman, for this was taken from man." This is why a man leaves his father and mother and joins himself to his wife, and they become one body.

For the one who sanctifies, and the ones who are sanctified, are of the same stock; that is why he openly calls them brothers.

THE GOSPEL

Mark 10:2-16

The Lord be with you. And with your spirit.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark. **Glory to you, O Lord.**

Some Pharisees approached Jesus and asked, "Is it against the law for a man to divorce his wife." They were testing him. He answered them, "What did Moses command you?" "Moses allowed us" they said "to draw up a writ of dismissal and so to divorce." Then Jesus said to them, "It was because you were so un-teachable that he wrote his commandment for you. But from the beginning of creation God made them male and female. This is why a man must leave father and mother, and the two become one body. They are no longer two, therefore, but one body. So then, what God has united, man must not divide. Back in the house the disciples questioned him again about this, and he said to them, "The man who divorces his wife and marries another is guilty of adultery against her. And if a woman divorces her husband and marries another she is guilty of adultery too."

People were bringing little children to him, for him to touch them. The disciples turned them away, but when Jesus saw this he was indignant and said to them, "Let the little children come to me; do not stop them; for it is to such as these that the kingdom of God belongs. I tell you solemnly, anyone who does not welcome the kingdom of God like a little child will never enter it." Then he put his arms round them, laid his hands on them and gave them his blessing.

To help us enter more deeply into the feast, the focus of the evening will be on the Holy Rosary. There will be a presentation and a reflection on the Rosary – the history and some insights, especially those of St. Pope John Paul II, who added the Luminous Mysteries to the traditional praver. SYNOD 2024

The 2024 meeting, which runs until 27 October, has 368 voting members (delegates), 272 of whom are bishops and 96 of whom are not bishops. Among the 96 non-bishops, around half are women.

The second Rome session of the Synod on Synodality began on Wednesday, 2 October, after a two-day retreat for participants and a public penitential service. The penitential liturgy in St Peter's on Tuesday was "intended to direct the work of the synod towards the beginning of <u>a new way of being Church</u>". Participants were specifically enjoined to confess sins against peace, against creation, indigenous people and migrants, against women, families and young people, against poverty and against synodality, and sins of abuse and of "using doctrine as stones to throw".

At the Mass in St Peter's Square to inaugurate the session on Wednesday morning, the Pope told participants that "the Lord places in our hands the history, dreams and hopes of a great people" and they must "strive to understand <u>the path we must</u> follow to reach the destination the Lord desires for us".

The Svnodal process, initiated in 2021, invited Catholics from around the world to have their say in how the church might become more inclusive and better at listening to all its members. The 87-year-old Francis, who has made synodality the centrepiece of his papacy and the primary vehicle for implementing church reforms, told those gathered under a partially sunny, but overcast October sky that the issues facing the synod are "great and delicate" and must be guided by humility and careful listening, but always seeking harmonv.

On Friday, Oct. 11, there will be an ecumenical prayer service in Rome's Piazza of the Proto-Martyrs, where, according to tradition, St. Peter was crucified upside down. The date, Oct. 11, marks the 62nd anniversary of the opening of the Second Vatican Council in 1962.

SVP SUMMER RAFFLE
