

THE BEATITUDES

MATTHEW 5:1-12

In this passage, Jesus goes up a mountain and begins to teach the crowds. What He says is surprising – even revolutionary. He doesn't praise the strong or the successful. Instead, He calls the poor in spirit, the gentle, the grieving, the merciful, the peacemakers, and even the persecuted, "blessed".

The world often tells us that blessing means wealth, comfort, or popularity. But Jesus turns that upside down. He shows us that God's blessing is found in humility, compassion, and a heart open to others – even in suffering.

To be "poor in spirit" means knowing our need for God. To be "meek" is not weakness, but strength that is kind. Those who hunger and thirst for righteousness are people who long to see justice and goodness in the world.

Jesus isn't offering a list of rules – He's painting a picture of the kind of people who live close to God. And more than that, He is describing Himself. The Beatitudes show us the heart of Christ.

When we try to live them – even imperfectly – we reflect His light in the world. The road may be hard, but Jesus promises: "Rejoice and be glad, for your reward will be great in heaven." ■

DO

Choose one Beatitude to focus on today – for example, being merciful or making peace – and find one simple way to live it out in your words or actions.

LEARN

True blessing isn't about wealth or success – it's about having a heart like Christ's: humble, merciful, peaceful, and open to God, even in difficulty.

REFLECT

When Jesus sits down on the mountainside and begins to teach, He doesn't give us a set of commands – He gives us a vision of a blessed life. But it's not the kind of life the world usually admires.

He says the poor in spirit are blessed – not the proud. The gentle, not the powerful. The grieving, not the cheerful. Those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, not those who settle for comfort. The merciful, the pure in heart, the peacemakers, and even those who are insulted or persecuted for doing the right thing – Jesus calls all of them "blessed."

Why? Because the Beatitudes show us the heart of God. They show us the kind of life that brings us closest to Jesus. This is not about pretending we have it all together. It's about being honest in our need for God and choosing love, mercy, and justice – even when it's hard.

Jesus doesn't just speak these blessings – He lives them. He mourns, He makes peace, He is meek, and He suffers for righteousness. He invites us to follow Him along this same path.

The world may not always notice or reward that kind of life – but Jesus does. And He calls it blessed. ■

And because of him you are in Christ Jesus, who became to us wisdom from God, righteousness, and sanctification, and redemption; so that, as it is written, 'Let the one who boasts, boast in the Lord.'

Blessed are the peacemakers, for they shall be called sons of God. Blessed are those who are persecuted for righteousness' sake, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

1906 - 2026 - 120 YEARS OF ST PATRICK'S

In preparation of the 120 years celebration St Patrick's will be undergoing refurbishment and will be temporarily closed from **2nd February to 2nd March** whilst the works take place. A temporary home has been found at:

WREKIN COLLEGE CHAPEL

St Patrick's weekend Masses between 2nd February to 2nd March will take place at **Wrekin College Chapel, Sutherland Road, Wellington, Telford, TF1 3BH** at the same times as usual. Ash Wednesday Mass on 18th Feb, 7pm, will also be held there.

CAR PARKING

There is space for all and plenty of parking on the college car parks. Nobody should park on the surrounding roads. The Chapel will be accessible from 30minutes before each Mass.

Mobility Parking is access via Constitution Hill and is a short walk to the chapel. All other parking at Wrekin College can be accessed via Stanley Road, off Sutherland Road. Please see the supplement with this week's newsletter

The refurb will cost in the region of £25,000. Anybody who feels able to contribute towards this cost should let Fr Ravi know.
